The thought; what if I write a screenplay that I could just go out and freaking shoot. No production company, no fancy equipment, no real budget, no crew — no problem. The result is a flick that I'm extremely proud of. Sergeant Pickle Breath and The Rooftop Warriors is hardly the perfect film, but it is the perfect representation of who I am.

LOGLINE

A pot dealing man-baby is forced to find a new crib when his roommate/best friend threatens to destroy his teddy bear if he doesn't move out.

SYNOPSIS

RUFUS is perfectly content spending the rest of his life pushing marijuana, chilling on the roof, and playing with his childhood teddy bear. Lovebirds ANDREW and CLAIRE are sick of living with Rufus and putting up with his shenanigans. Andrew reaches his breaking point when Rufus mischievously cooks Andrew and Claire a cannabis infused breakfast. As a last resort, Andrew threatens to destroy Rufus's teddy if he doesn't move out.

In order to save his beloved Sergeant Pickle Breath, Rufus tackles any New Yorker's worst nightmare... finding new roommates.

If there's a "right" way to make a movie... this wasn't it... and that goes along with the flick's theme — march to the beat of your own drum. Do things your way... especially if your way ain't the right way.

Greatly influenced by indie darlings such as
The Duplass Brothers' *The Puffy Chair* and Kevin
Smith's *Clerks — Sergeant Pickle Breath and The*Rooftop Warriors leans into its nonexistent budget
and DIY/Run&Gun style with a ruggedness
emphasized by its low contrast almost faded
B&W. Cinematic charm comes from the
anamorphic lens' that make use of the intense
flares usually reserved for sci-fi films. The "look"
of this picture is old-school talkies combined
with soft focus, bokeh, and lens distortion,
creating a unique look rarely seen in modern
comedies.
